Traffic Safety Report

The City is starting to question the wisdom contained in the GO Plan, which is a problem since everything they have been doing for the last 7 years is based on the GO Plan. They need to stick to the basic premise of the GO Plan, which is to improve transit and also get people working at home and living closer to where they work. They are also starting to realize that we need more roadways built in the City. Where those new roadways should be is up to the City Planners – but we obviously need them.

We do not need to abandon the GO Plan – we simply need the City to start adding to it.

Our traffic plans are on hold while the City uses the excuse that ours is a joint study with Elbow Park and they are not ready yet. Elbow Park is not holding us up – the City is, and they are using Elbow Park as the excuse.

Getting 40 km/hr on the community collectors should get through the City Traffic Committee in January – if not we will get to wait longer for the ball to start rolling.

All the Inner City communities are getting benefits from the GO Plan. The same City initiatives that are letting us protect our roadways in Mount Royal are providing benefits to other Inner City Communities. Cliff Bungalow wants the 5th Street and 2nd Street lane reversal project to go ahead, Rideau-Roxborough have already had their measures installed, Elbow Park is trying to improve Sifton, etc, etc. We, as a community, are supporting all these other initiatives with the hope that they are all supporting our initiatives. Mostly, I believe this to be the case.

I have told Alderman King that we wish to work with the City to get things done but she is new to her position and is trying to get a feel for the relative importance of Traffic in Mount Royal and whether it is really something that we want her to be pushing for now or can it slip. And slip – as does everything that the City is involved with.

The narrowing of the crosswalk on Council Way has been slipping for 8 months now; our 40km/hr signs seem to be slipping, as are our



traffic measure implementation. The City has yet to officially commit that 8th Street will be protected at the same time that 5th Street becomes a two way street. The City has yet to commit to protect 30th, Premier and Council by implementing measures at the same time as on Sifton.

I phone the City two or three times a week on your behalf but they start to not listen to the same voice if they hear it to often. So it is now your turn to let your voice be heard – if you want things to happen.

Some of the City Council members think that the City cannot afford to spend money on the Inner City. They seem to forget that due to Market Value Assessment, we certainly pay our fair share into the system and therefore deserve our fair share out of the system.

Give your Alderman a call, or two – let her know that it is time to speak up. It is not necessary to follow the lead of the other Aldermen, since she is the ONLY one representing Mount Royal.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS
June 30th, 2001

1. Purpose of the Organization

The Mount Royal Community Association provides services for members living in the Mount Royal Community.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Capital Assets

Major capital assets which comprise the community clubhouse and associated equipment, are recorded at cost less \$ 99,555 of Government financial assistance. Minor asset acquisitions are expensed in the year of acquisition. Major capital assets are depreciated over a forty year period, on a straight-line basis.

Donations

The Association derives a portion of funding from the public in the form of donations. General cash donations are recorded as revenue at the time received.

Income Taxes

The Association is a registered charitable organization and is exempt from income tax under Section 149 of the Income Tax Act (Canada) and is able to issue donation receipts for income tax purposes. In order to maintain its tax exempt status, the Association must meet certain requirements which, in the opinion of management, have been met.

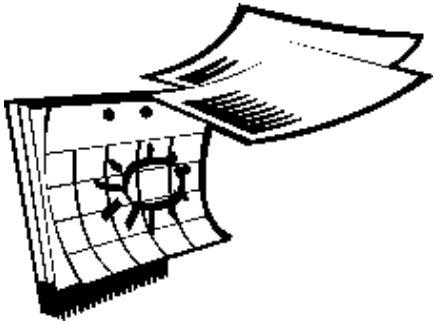

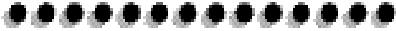
