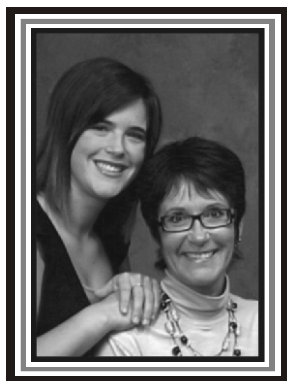

From the Traffic Safety Director

A few of us neighbors got together the other night to talk traffic – you know traffic circles, short-cutting through the community and issues with folks using Mount Royal streets as an alternative to the congested 17th Ave. S.W. All this talk got us to thinking, what would Mount Royal be like in 10 or 20 years – would we still be facing the same issues except on a larger scale? Would we be able to protect the quality of life and sense of community that we enjoy? As we debated these points, it became clear that we would need to take a proactive stance if these quality of life criteria were important. This led us to identify four priority initiatives:

- to document and present to the City current traffic safety issues for resolution
- to complete the landscaping of the current traffic circles
- to complete an evaluation of the current traffic calming measures and identify future community initiatives to deal with population growth, increasing traffic volumes and the resultant pressures placed on inner city communities
- to initiate community fund raising to support these activities

When we talk about quality of life issues, in my mind this translates into a community where pedestrian safety and access are paramount, where we value and preserve green spaces, where visitors to our community clearly recognize that they are entering a special and unique place and drive as if they were a resident – safely, slowly and with complete consideration for the safety of all. A community as described will remain a special place, where property values will be protected and enhanced as we focus on making Mount Royal a better community. On the other hand, if we choose to accept increased cut-through traffic and yield to

the obvious pressures of development in our midst we will surely see a depreciation of quality of life and erosion of the elements that make Mount Royal the special place that it is.

Over the next few months we will continue to discuss these points and encourage you to take part. I will provide details on future meetings and look forward to your participation as we work together to enhance the quality of life in our historic community of Mount Royal.



Greetings from Alderman King!

Community enhancing events and initiatives can receive funding from the Council Strategic Initiative Fund (CSIF). There is \$8,000.00 available in Ward 8 and I look forward to talking with you about any plans you are making for your community. The application deadline is July 15. For further information and for the application form, search Council Strategic Initiative Fund on the City website at www.calgary.ca. Or call the Ward 8 Constituent Assistant Tanya Drewlo at 268-2431.

Following the successful appeal of Sunalta and Scarboro communities (and other neighbours) against the planning department's permit for the John Howard Society to build a half way house for federal parolees in Sunalta, congratulations are due to the community volunteers who devoted hundreds of hours to fighting this battle for their neighbourhoods, as well as the residents who donated significant dollars for the cause. The group researched the issue so thoroughly that much of the information they brought forward will influence the City's planning department for years to come.

What was accepted by the SDAB is that this was a poor choice of location for such a facility. It was acknowledged by all concerned that the John Howard Society provides an important service, enabling federal parolees the opportunity to adjust to life after jail, and that there are other locations where it would not necessarily pose a threat. The Society does have a very good track record in Victoria Park where it has operated for over 20 years.

As the ward alderman I'm not allowed to try to influence the SDAB. If the question had ever gone to Council, I would have supported the communities in opposing the Sunalta location. The John Howard Society does have to find a new home. They have indicated they hope it will be in Victoria Park. At this stage it's too early to tell whether this site will work out better than that in Sunalta. Certainly the siting of this facility is the most challenging issue – there are compelling arguments on both sides.

Wednesday Playgroup - Going Strong, Fall 2007 Coordinator Needed

The Wednesday Parents and Tots playgroup is going strong. After surging to 15 kids in the fall, we have settled into a more comfortable typical attendance of 10 kids. From 16 months to 4 yrs, the kids are bonding well and having fun. Our contribution to the facilities this fall was a Koala changing station in the bathroom.

This will be my last term coordinating the playgroup. Unfortunately, the other regular parents have kids starting Nursery School in the Fall. Please think about us this spring if you are interested in continuing to carry the torch in the fall.

Compassionate Moms And Grandmas Needed

Mom and Grandmother volunteers are needed to work in the new HOME START PROGRAM.

Home Start is a volunteer organization that matches volunteers with moms who may be struggling with their new role. These moms may be new to the city or to Canada and don't have family friends to help or support them. In some cases they are just lonely and need a friend.

The volunteers provide both emotional and practical support to the moms with whom they are matched. The help needed could be anything from looking after the children while mom has some time alone or sharing in some activity.

Volunteers must attend a 30-hour training program (three hours a week over a ten week period). The commitment is four hours a week with mom, for a minimum of one year. Volunteers can make a difference to a family that can endure through generations.

Report from Lee Richardson

Finance Minister Jim Flaherty recently announced Advantage Canada, a program that will create a climate for economic success by:

- Eliminating Canada's net national debt in less than a generation;
- Adopting a Tax Back Guarantee and using the interest saved from the debt repayment to reduce personal income taxes;
- Enhancing workers' skills through post-secondary education and training;
- Reducing the paperwork burden for business by 20%;
- Building modern infrastructure such as roads, bridges and public transit through public private partnerships;

Advantage Canada will strengthen Canada's position in the world and allow more Canadians to fulfill their dream of getting a good job, purchasing their own home and saving for retirement.

Progress on Passports...

On January 23, 2007 a new American law affecting air travellers came into effect.

Our government has responded to the corresponding increase in passport demand by adding 500 additional employees. Staff are working around the clock to address the backlog and process the 21 000 applications received daily, without jeopardizing the integrity and security of our cherished passports. Hopefully the backlog will be cleared by April 1 and we will resume normal turnover time for passport applications.

Crime in Upper and Lower Mount Royal

I would like to take this opportunity to introduce myself as your Community Liaison Officer from the Calgary Police Service. I have been a police officer for 10 years and have a wide variety of experience in various areas of the Police Service.

As you are aware, there are 4 zones in Two District and we operate out of the Police Station located at 4506 – 17 Ave SW. There are respectively 4 Community Liaison Officers for the District. My communities include Bankview, South Calgary, Altadore, North Glenmore Park, Lakeview, Lincoln Park, CFB-Lincoln Park, CFB-Currie, Upper Mount Royal and Elbow Park. As a Community Liaison Officer, my duties include maintaining communication with the City Aldermen, Community Associations, By-law Services, City of Calgary Planning and Parks and Recreation.

I have recently been made aware of some problems in the Upper and Lower Mount Royal areas with regards to drug activity, crime and transients in the area. As a Community Liaison Officer I have created directed patrols for the area for 2-3 constables and I have also notified Calgary Bylaw Services to patrol the parks in the areas for any Bylaw infractions that are being committed. As community members there are several things that you can do:

Initiate Calls for Service. – If you see suspicious activity, vehicles, or persons, please call the complaint line at 266-1234. To get through in a more timely fashion, press ‘0’. This includes noise complaints, suspicious persons, drug activity, etc. If you are witness to a crime in progress, such as a fight, property damage or break and enter please dial 911. Keep in Mind – good personal descriptions of all parties involved, vehicle descriptions, direction of travel, etc...The more information you can provide our dispatch the better.

Community involvement / Blockwatch:
- Communication within the community and between the community and the Police Service is invaluable. The Police cannot be everywhere all of the time. To have a strong network of concerned community members is invaluable. I would be happy to facilitate the start-up of Blockwatch in your communities.

Contact your Community Liaison Officer – If you have specific concerns or there is anyone in the community that might be contributing to the problems, I can talk to them and give them warnings. In the past, talking directly to the people who have been causing problems such as noise complaints and parties, has worked extremely well.

I believe that if we work together as a community we can come up with solutions to this problem or any problem that may arise.

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Victims of Graffiti

Recently there has been an increase in calls to the police regarding graffiti in some neighborhoods. If you have been a victim of graffiti, please file a complaint by calling the City of Calgary information line at 3-1-1, or on the web at www.calgary.ca. A City of Calgary Bylaw Enforcement officer will attend and take pictures of the graffiti.

Property owners are responsible for painting over, or cleaning the graffiti on their property, but can obtain color match paint, and removal supplies at a reduced cost. See www.calgary.ca for more information.

The sooner the graffiti is removed, the less likely it is to re-appear. If you see someone painting graffiti, call the Calgary Police at 266-1234 and provide as much information as possible, including clothing descriptions (i.e. shoes, ball cap, back pack, etc.) a location of the place of occurrence, whether the offenders are on foot, or in a vehicle. If a vehicle is involved, try to provide a make, model, color, or license plate if possible to obtain.

The City of Calgary Bylaw Services has an active data base that is recording all TAGS (the signature used by the Graffiti “artists”) and the data base includes all previous locations where the TAGS have been painted. Your information may assist in helping the police lay charges where applicable. The fine for applying Graffiti under the Bylaw is \$1000.00 for youth, and \$5000.00 for an adult.

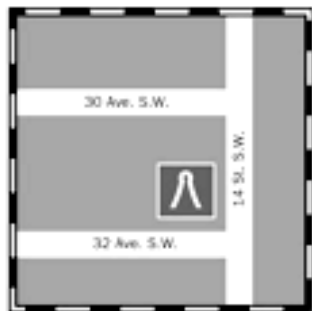
