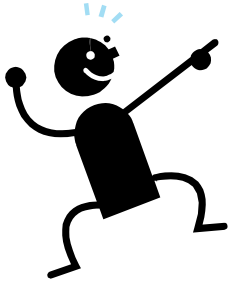

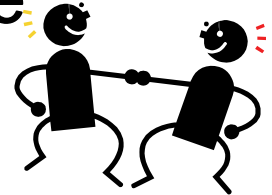

## Mount Royal School

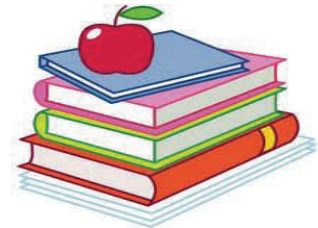

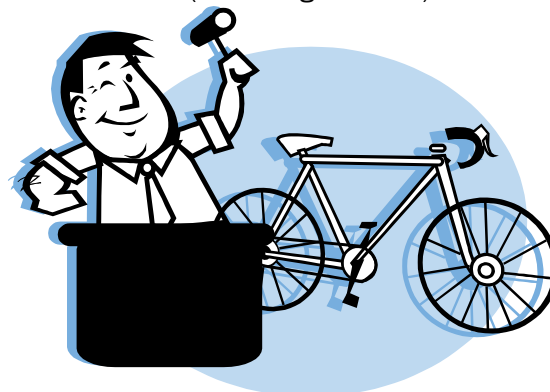

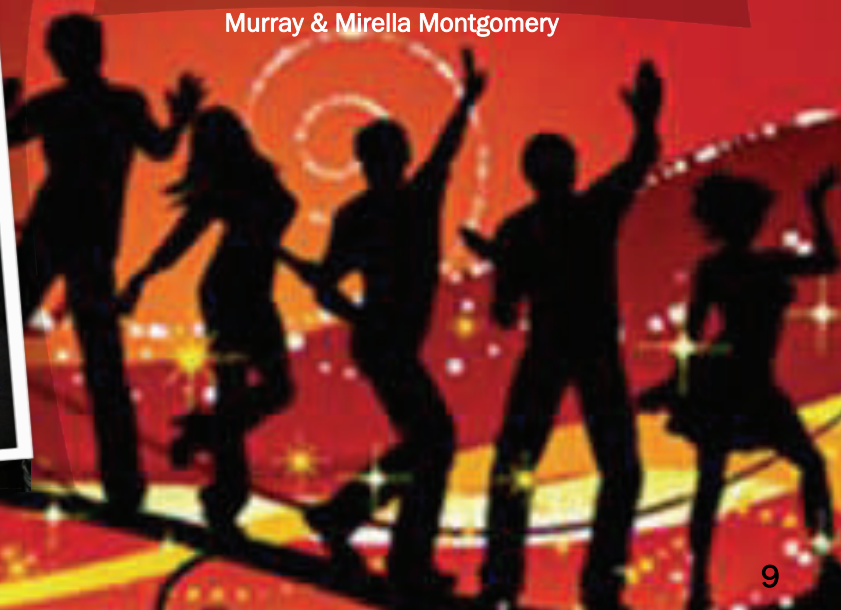

**JOHN MAR**  
ALDERMAN, WARD 8

Alderman Mar voted to discontinue the use of fluoride when the measure came to Council last year, with a majority of Council members in support of fluoride use, the motion lost. On January 10<sup>th</sup> 2011 another motion to remove Fluoride from our water was

brought to Council where it was referred to The Special Policy Committee Utilities and Environment for January 26<sup>th</sup>, 2011. Alderman Mar has met with both proponents and opponents hearing compelling evidence for and against fluoridation.

While many point out the potential dental benefits, there is considerable evidence against the use of fluoride in drinking water;

- Health Canada recommended reduced use of fluoride for children because too much of the chemical from diet, water and toothpaste places them at an increased risk of fluorosis.
- A 1996 study by researchers at Guiyang Medical College details fluoride exposure among pregnant mothers can disrupt the synthesis of neurotransmitters and receptors in the brain cells of the fetus. Such effects could lead to long-lasting defects in brain function after birth.
- Another study shows infants born to mothers with a history of high fluoride exposure exhibit differences in neuro-behavioural function shortly after birth, including delayed reaction to visual and auditory stimulus.
- The National Kidney Foundation has and is advising patients with chronic kidney disease that potential health risks from fluoridated water exist.

Another argument to cease the process of fluoridation point to the fact that ethically fluoridation presents a conflict between benefiting the common good and infringing on the individual rights of others.

Lastly, we should consider the costs. Currently, it costs The City of Calgary \$750,000 annually to add fluoride to our drinking water. Out of every \$1000 the City spends on Fluoridation, \$995 is used for activities other than drinking water, such as washing dishes etc... Of the remaining \$5.00 that is spent on fluoridation for drinking water specifically, only \$ .50 of the original \$1000 promotes our children's oral health.

This decision is a timely one, as The City begins upgrades to water treatment plants, the estimated capital cost to the Bearspaw and Glenmore fluoride systems, is figured at over \$6 million. Alderman Mar urges you to come to the Special Policy Committee Utilities and Environment on January 26<sup>th</sup>, 2011 beginning at 9:30am and have your say in this important debate.

## DAVE TAYLOR MLA, CALGARY-CURRIE

Report to Constituents  
February, 2011

Hello everybody,

The spring session of the Alberta Legislature is set to begin shortly. From where I sit, there are three pressing issues - health, the economy, and the environment - that need attention, direction, and solutions now. If MLAs from all sides of the house put Albertans' interests ahead of their own partisan politics and start working together, we could get a lot of work done on all three issues. But, with the next provincial election no more than a year away, the temptation will be to get more intensely partisan, not less so.

But elected politicians from different backgrounds can work together if they try. It's a common occurrence these days at City Hall. And, I've even seen it happen among MLAs at least three times in the last six months. I received unanimous, all-party support at committee for my motion recommending that the Province of Alberta pursue a poverty reduction strategy. My amendment to change the name of the Dunvegan-Central Peace riding to honour the late Grant Notley - the much-respected longtime leader of the Alberta NDP who was sadly killed in a plane crash in 1984 - was also passed. And this fall I led a successful campaign involving all members of the opposition parties to convince the government to pull its seriously flawed Alberta Parks Act (Bill 29) from debate.

So we can work together if we want to.

One of the big issues this spring will be the provincial budget. The Stelmach Government is running a five billion dollar deficit, and the question is how and when to get Alberta back in the black. It's important to come up with the right answer to that question - a pragmatic approach that keeps Albertans working, provides the services and the infrastructure Albertans need, stops wasting money on things we don't need, and provides a road map to get us back on track.

No single political entity has the lock on the right answer. Each presents a slightly different perspective, but the point is to take all those perspectives into account. That's the best answer.

We can do this, if we want to.

#### What can I report online?

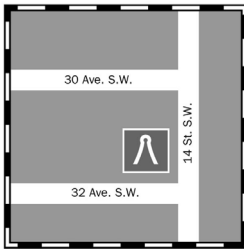

- Loss Property
- Theft
- Damage/Mischief to Property or Vehicle
- Theft from Vehicle

#### How do I report a crime online?

To report crime online, go to [www.calgarypolice.ca](http://www.calgarypolice.ca), and click on "Citizen Online Police Report system." Follow the screen prompts to fill in the information and submit your report. If you have a problem with the system, there's 24-hour support available at 403-206-8318.

When you're finished, you can print a copy of the police report to keep for your records. Police will review your case, and will contact you if needed.

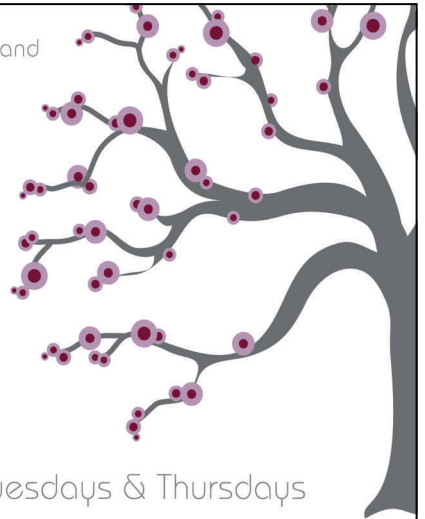

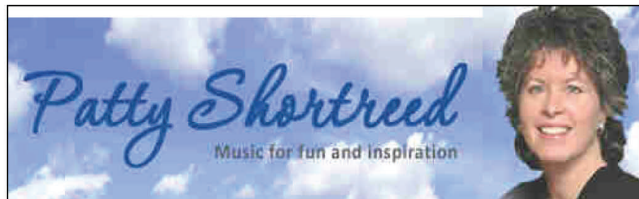

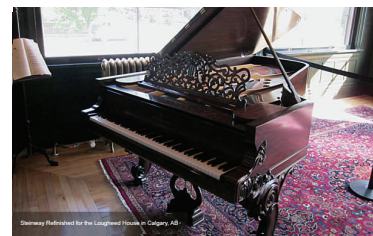
